Things I have advocated for in the past and will continue to advocate for if elected:

  - ◆ Better publicising of **childcare options** (the ones we have now are better than a creche! People just need to know about them!)
  - Better publicising of the Access Fund (both for donors and people who need it
  - Better publicising of Newbies events
