We are a membershipled party and it is vital that Conference reflects that.

I want to make sure that grassroots members are able to engage more with all Conference has to offer, and look at new ways to break down barriers to people getting involved.

I think remote voting has had some successes, and the FCC should keep looking at how further

hybrid elements could work as resources allow.

Being part of the Committee that took Conference back to Harrogate for the first time since 2006 is something I proud of - but I'd like us to be able to visit an even greater variety of places.

FCC should report on the diversity of keynote speakers across the three-year term. I would work with Eleanor Kelly, also standing for FCC, to consult with parents and improve support



for families in and around Conference.

Part of this will be to strengthen and better publicise the Conference Access Fund which provides financial support for those who need it, whether towards travel, accommodation, childcare costs, or caregiving costs
