Dear Member,

ou may wonder, why am I as a former MP and government Minister choosing this moment to seek election again for Federal Conference Committee?

I am standing because I believe conference is at the heart of how we as a party navigate the crisis Britain faces and I want to play my part.

Since standing down from Parliament in 2015, I've watched political discourse become more toxic, more polarised and less civilised. Democracy itself is at a crossroads with those most vulnerable in society often being victimised the most.

I ran a refugee charity for 9 years after leaving Parliament. I have seen first hand the way culture wars have intensified and the terrible effect this has on marginalised communities in Britain.

Why I am standing for Conference Committee

I have seen how quickly disagreements in public discourse turn to aggressive conflict. We have become unable to speak to one another or to listen, not only on immigration but on many topics that now divide us with terrible consequences.

Our party has always been the liberal voice, challenging inequality, promoting social justice, amplifying voices that are silenced, marginalised and demonised. Holding space for people with different perspectives to coexist is what we are about.

And conference is at the heart of this.

Conference sets our agenda and is our platform. It's the voice of Liberal Democrat members and it's grounded in our ideals as a party. Every voice matters: every member has the same rights whether Party Leader, elected representative or former government Minister. We must never forget this. This is what makes us who we are; this is what makes us Liberal Democrats.

Conference is also the place where we can showcase how we can disagree, debate and decide policy – with respect – even when dealing with deeply held convictions and opposing views. Our party prizes this space. We do it well, and it is a gift that we can give back to the wider body of politics and the country.

There is further to go of course on making it possible for all to get their voice heard at conference. Attending conference remains too expensive for some. It doesn't always reflect modern liberal Britain. And it still remains inaccessible for many.

As a party, we have a critical role to play over the next few years. With an increasingly authoritarian Labour Government and a beleaguered Conservative Party dancing to the tune of Nigel Farage and Donald Trump, it's vital that every Liberal Democrat member is able to play a role in our most important platform: **conference**.
